6. Divine Love:

- How does the baptism of Jesus provide a window into the relationship between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit? What can we learn about the nature of God's love from this event?
- 7. Practical Steps: This passage ends with a call to action. Pastor Keith said:
- First, say yes to Jesus' invitation. Say, Yes to your need for forgiveness. Say yes to his love.
- Second, follow Jesus. Follow him into the waters of baptism. If you haven't been baptized and you've said yes to Jesus, it's time to jump in. Follow Jesus in baptism but also follow Jesus in saying yes to Father, follow Jesus in the kind of love that serves other people.
- Third, delight in the words the eternal God is speaking over you today. "You are my child whom I love, in you I am well pleased." Share together which apply to you today?
